Complete the activities on pages 2-5 and then use the story starter on page 1 to write your own story. - In class, we are writing letters to the new Reception class telling them all about St Mary's and welcoming them. Reflect how they lead us to Jesus. - Find out about a time when a pope has visited the UK (clue: John Paul II in 1982). Where did they visit? Why did they visit? What did they do? What did the local people do? 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Create a self-portrait in the style of the front cover of Wonder (See the example in this week's home learning). Around your portrait write positive words about your character and words which reflect your interests and life.
